Dear Parent, Teacher and Employee:

This letter is notification that your school is in compliance with the Federal Asbestos Hazardous Emergency Response Act (AHERA). The AHERA-required Management Plan is on file at your school's administration offices.

AHERA requires all schools, kindergarten through twelfth grade, to be inspected to identify any Asbestos-Containing Building Materials (ACBMs). The law further requires the development of a Management Plan based on the findings of the inspection, which outlines our intent in controlling the potential for exposure to asbestos fibers in our schools. In the past, asbestos was used in building materials because of its insulating and fire retarding capabilities. Virtually any building built before the late 1970s contains some ACBMs. The materials are distributed in various locations and may include floor tiles, pipe insulation and mechanical areas not readily accessible to building occupants or students.

Our Management Plan has been in place since 1989. It outlines in detail the methods used to maintain the materials in a safe manner. It also contains a schedule for the phased removal of these materials as applicable.


The Archdiocese of Seattle's plan is on file for your review at the Archdiocesan Office of Property and Construction Services located at 710 Ninth Ave., Seattle, Washington 98104. Each school's building inspection reports are on file in their respective administrative offices.

The Archdiocese of Seattle's schools are taking the necessary steps to ensure that the school's buildings are safe for the students, employees, and volunteers. We share with you the desire to have a safe and healthy learning environment for our children and employees.

Please be assured that our schools have completed the necessary steps to be in compliance with the law.

Box Tops for Education is all about the difference that one box top can make. Each box top turned-in is worth \$0.10 and here's what to do:

With Funds Raised during the 2015-2016 school years, the Parent Association was able to purchase 15 laptop computers to supplement those received from a STEM grant. Feedback from the teachers has been overwhelmingly positive!

Senorita Parisa say: "In Spanish, seventh grade students are using laptops to create their autobiographies online through the online presentation website called *Prezi*. Fifth grade is using them to research their Mexican State and create a travel brochure about what they learned. Sixth grade will use them to create their "How To" presentations in the spring. Third and Fourth grades will be using them to log onto Duo Lingo once a month to practice their Spanish fluency."

Mrs. Santucci reports that sixth grade will use them for internet research for various Social Studies and Religion topics, as well as for word processing and publishing of written pieces, graphic arts and presentation slide shows.

Mrs. Short's fourth grade class will use them for research topics for science projects, special reports and Washington State History reports. She says that "there are several WeDo2 projects that fit with what they are learning in Washington State History."

Mrs. Wachob plans to use them in the spring when the kindergartners type out their poetry projects.

In addition to all of these projects, the computers are easing the use of Lego WeDo and Lego EV3 programs implemented last year.

Happy First Birthday to Harper Ly Foy

Our miracle girl turned one on Tuesday, September 20th. We are so grateful for all of the prayers, meals, emotional and financial support that this parish community has provided to our family. We were so blessed to have all of you and we can never thank you enough! Your prayers have been working and the thoughts and well wishes are very much appreciated. Our family will always be grateful for the generosity provided.

It's been a difficult first year of life for Harper. Her first several months of life were spent in Seattle Children's Hospital undergoing several surgeries and a lot of unknowns. But through the support of family, friends and the parish we were able to celebrate her first birthday without any major complications.

Harper has had NO infections her first year; she has two teeth now; currently weighing in at 15.7 lbs. ; she loves to eat and she loves to feed herself- her favorite foods currently are eggs, fruit, noodles; rice and yogurt. In addition, she has just learned to sit up on her own (this is MAJOR since her skin is so dry and this condition places a lot of limitations on growth and movement) and she is trying very hard to talk although it comes out right now as a growl which makes us all laugh! She is tiny but is wearing an 18 - 24 month in clothing. She gets chilled easily so we are starting to focus on building her winter wardrobe. She is limited on what she is able to wear because of her skin, so we try to keep her in organic, very soft clothing.

It has been difficult for us to ask and receive help but we realize many of you are following and interested in Harper's story and we appreciate the support.

We have a GoFundMe account set up that we are using to help offset the costs that are not covered for Harper through Children's or through Kevin's medical insurance. We have to buy special clothing for her because her skin is so delicate. We go through a 14 oz. jar of Aquaphor every three days and we use organic coconut oil at bath time. We make certain that all her foods are organic so there is less risk of her ingesting a bacteria or anomaly that might be found in processed foods.

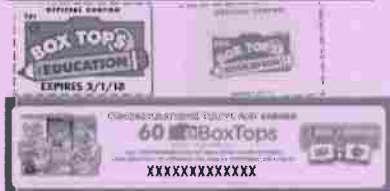

GUIDELINES

--Only students from invited schools with permission slips and current student ID are welcome.

--After entering the dance, students must stay until their ride arrives.

--Students are expected to respect all school property and other persons in attendance.

--Alcohol, tobacco, and drugs, in possession or consumed, will be cause for removal from the dance and/or referral to the police.

--No weapons of any kind will be allowed on school/parish property.

--No obscene language or clothing will be allowed.

--No hats, coats, purses, vests, backpacks, sports bags are allowed in the gym during the dance. Coat-check will be available.

--Inappropriate styles of dances are not acceptable.

DRESS CODE

--All students are expected to dress appropriately. Clothing must be in good repair and fit the wearer properly, neither too large nor too small. There should be no holes or tears or signs of excessive wear. The clothing, messages, logos, pictures, drawings, or slogans may not conflict with Catholic values. Camouflage and paramilitary attire are not acceptable. Shorts and skirts should be three inches above the knee or longer (pencil skirts included). NO Low-rise pants, strapless shirts, tank tops, halter-tops, crop tops or spaghetti straps are allowed. Bishop Blanchet High School reserves the right to deny admittance for dress code violations not limited to the above.

Non-compliance with the above guidelines and dress policy may result in direct communication with parents and/or school administrators.

I understand that this event will take place on school/parish grounds, and that adult chaperones will be present throughout the dance. My child agrees to abide by all guidelines set forth by the event sponsors. As parent or legal guardian, I am legally responsible for that which may result from any personal actions taken by my child during this event. I agree to release and hold harmless Bishop Blanchet High School, the Archdiocese of Seattle, and their agents and employees from financial responsibility incurred as a result of my child's participation. In the event of an emergency, where medical treatment is required, I give permission to an adult leader to obtain services of an EMT, physician, or hospital staff.
